Finally, he hung up and asked the visitor, "Can I help you?" The man said, "Sure. I'm here to install the phone!"

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


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# **Opee's Interesting Facts Eww! School Cafeterias Serve WHAT?**

"Good," said the coach. "Now go over there and explain it to your parents."














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# Maybe He Is a Van Gogh
